





SYLLABUS

- Advanced understanding of forces, angles and anchor systems
- Rigging fall protection systems such as tensioned ropes, fall arrest, travel restraint and work positioning
- Appropriate understanding and selection of edge management systems
- Understanding of equipment selection, standards, inspection, care and maintenance
- Advanced rope techniques such as vertical aidclimbing
- Understanding and use of pulley systems and mechanical advantage in hauling and lowering systems
- Advanced rescues: Basic, climbing and transfer rescues

CERTIFICATION

IRATA and SPRAT certifications are valid for 3 years Successful candidates are issued a certificate, card and logbook

PRE-REQUISITES

- Same health, aptitude and attitude as Level 1
- Proficiency in all L1 techniques
- IRATA: Valid IRATA Level 1 certification + 1000 logged hours + 12 months as an IRATA Level 1
- **SPRAT:** Level 1 SPRAT certification **+** 500 logged hours **+** 6 months as a SPRAT Level 1

DURATION

5 days + 1 day for independent examination

TRAINING RATIO AND SIZE

6 trainees per Instructor (6:1) Max. 16 candidates

Performed on the 6th day by independent third party assessor / evaluator
